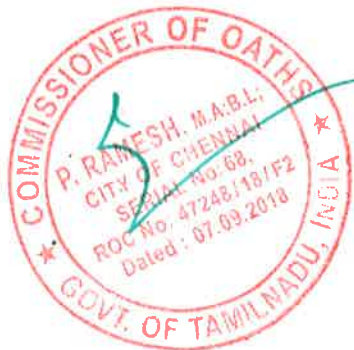

PREAMBLE

It is considered necessary to establish a Foundation for education at the most basic level viz. The field of pure consciousness, which is the fountainhead of all knowledge.

There has been age old need of an organisation which will function at the subtlest level of creation and enliven the full potential of Individual thereby bringing him to the field of all possibilities.

With the grace of GURU DEV Bhagwan Shankaracharya of Jyotirmath His Divinity Swami Brahamanand Saraswati, the knowledge of enlivening consciousness has now become available through the Science of Creative Intelligence and its practical aspect Transcendental Meditation Technique as propounded by His Holiness Maharishi Mahesh Yogi Ji, which have been found to enrich all levels of individual life and also through their effect on collective consciousness, to make the trends of life of Society more evolutionary:

Scientific research has shown that people practicing Transcendental Meditation Technique not only exhibit more energy and less fatigue, more orderly thinking based on higher brain wave synchrony and coherence and many other indications of improved physical and mental health, but also that they produce a powerful effect of harmony and orderliness in the environment and that when the number of those practicing Transcendental Meditation approaches one per cent in any city, the quality of life in that community spontaneously improves, with decrease in sickness, crime and accidents, and growth in positivity.

Now, therefore, it is hereby decided to establish an Educational Foundation with the name "MAHARISHI INSTITUTE OF CREATIVE INTELLIGENCE" to disseminate the knowledge of the Science of Creative Intelligence and Transcendental Meditation.

MAHARISHI INSTITUTE OF CREATIVE INTELLIGENCE

1. The name of the Society is **Maharishi Institute of Creative Intelligence** in India.
2. The registered office of the society shall be at A-14, Mohar Co-operative Industrial Estate, Mathura Road, New Delhi- 44 or at such other place as may be decided from time to time. Any other change in the address shall be notified to the members by the General Secretary within 14 days of the occurrence.
3. **The aims and objects for which the Society is formed are :-**
 - (a) To spread the knowledge of the Science of Creative Intelligence as brought to light by it's founder Maharishi Mahesh Yogi.
 - (b) To open training Centres throughout India in accordance with the World Plan formulated by Maharishi Mahesh Yogi.
 - (c) To take steps for the establishment in each University in India a separate faculty for the teaching of the Science of Creative Intelligence.
 - (d) To get the Science of Creative Intelligence made a subject of teaching and examination in all the different colleges.
 - (e) To establish links with the Maharishi International University in the U.S.A. and other countries for mutual furtherance of the goals of M.I.U.

(f) To develop the full potential of the individual.

- (1) To propagate the knowledge of Transcendental Meditation and its theoretical aspect Science of Creative as brought to light by His Holiness Maharishi Mahesh Yogi Ji.
- (2) To establish Centres for teaching Transcendental Meditation.
- (3) To conduct courses for making teachers of Transcendental Meditation & Science of Creative Intelligence.
- (4) To take all other measures and steps for propagation of Transcendental Meditation technique and Science of Creative Intelligence.

(g) To improve governmental achievements.

(h) To realise the highest ideal of education.

- (1) To set up, run, establish and manage educational Institutions, to provide education through correspondence courses, vocational courses and audiovisual system in various fields useful for the community at large.
- (2) To establish, set up, run and manage Institutions/Schools on Central Board of Secondary Education (C.B.S.E.) pattern or any other pattern

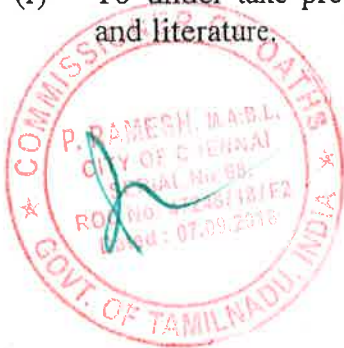
approved by the Central/State Governments or any other authority for promoting the education.

- (3) To undertake, promote, carry on and impart education related with any field – i.e. Art, Science, Religion, Spiritualism, Vedic Knowledge, Space, Science and Technology, Music, Dance, Drama etc. etc.
 - (4) To set up, acquire, own establish, subsidise, conduct, run and manage public Schools, Schools and Colleges, University/ies, Vidyapeeth, Vishwa Vidyapeeth, Vidhyalaya, Vishwavidhyala, Education Centre, Distant Education Centre, Technical/Non -Technical Education Centre/s.
 - (5) To provide ethical and moral education in the Schools, Colleges, Universities and other educational Institutions.
- (i) To solve the problems of crime, drug abuse and all behaviour that brings unhappiness to the family of man.
 - (j) To maximize the intelligent use of the environment.
 - (k) To bring fulfillment to the aspirations of the Individual and Society.

- (l) To achieve the spiritual goals of mankind in this generation.
- (m) To utilise the methodology of modern science for measuring and validating the formula of the Vedas or development of consciousness through the medium of Transcendental Meditation, T.M. Sidhi Programme and other similar tools.
- (n) To promote and encourage the study of the Vedas and the propagation of the Vedic Science thereof and to establish, acquire, maintain and support Institutions, Maharishi Ved Bhawans, Colleges, Vidyalayas, Schools, Study Centres, Libraries and other Educational Institutions for teaching of Vedic Science.
- (o) To research into, explore and establish the co-relation of Vedic knowledge with all other branches of knowledge and disciplines of life.
- (p) To experiment and research into and establish correlation and harmony between Vedic Science and Modern Science.
- (q) To promote the Scientific Validation of Vedic Knowledge by scientific experiments and to expound the theory of Science of Creative Intelligence, Transcendental Meditation and Universality of Vedic knowledge.
- (r) To under take promotion and learning of Sanskrit language and literature.

- (s) To assist nations in developing universal friendliness through Vedic Science.
- (t) To promote in every man an increasing fullness of life through the development of his inner potential through the study of the Vedas.
- (u) To investigate, verify and utilise the full potential of consciousness as the field of all possibilities and the source of infinite creativity in daily life.
- (v) To make recordings, films, video films and any other mode of audiovisual representation's, depicting the legends in the Vedas and other scriptures and to publish magazines, books and other literature, pictorially or otherwise represent such legends for dissemination of Vedic knowledge.
- (w) To spread and promote Vedic education in all its branches.
- (x) To establish and support Professorship, Fellowships, Lectureships, Scholarships, Loan Scholarships and distribute Prizes etc.
- (y) To establish and maintain Hostels and/or Boarding Houses and to grant free boarding and lodging to deserving students upon such terms and conditions as may be necessary.
- (z) To research in to and scientifically explore investigate and expound the science of Ayurveda.

- (aa) To establish, acquire, take-over, run, maintain and support Schools, Colleges, Vidyalas, Study circles and any other kind of Educational institutions, residential or non-residential for imparting Education of Modern Sciences, Applied sciences, Business and Commerce, Vocational, Medicinal, Engineering, Law, Arts, Architecture, Administration, Computer Sciences, Information Technology or any other disciplines.
- (bb) To take over the management and administration of any institution and otherwise already established.
- (cc) To sponsor, undertake, establish and execute any Society, Endowment and/or fund for the purpose of providing relief of on occasions of national calamities and floods or for any other purposes which may seem desirable and permissible within the meaning of the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
- (dd) To apply the funds of the society for the advancement of any other object of general public utility.
- (ee) To undertake and promote any activity that will enable the societies program to be self-sufficient and with the motive of bringing fulfillment to the object of the society and without any motive.
- (ff) To do or perform any other act which may be incidental or ancillary to the attainment of any of the objects of the society.

- (gg) To run various program & projects for relief of the weaker/poor section of society including medical educational, financial relief and various other programs of general public utility.
- (hh) To do or program any other act for the benefits of general public at large.
- (ii) To avail affiliation for either any of the institutions established by the Society for the Society from any State/Central Education Board, any other concerned Authority or an University.
- (jj) To do or program any act necessary for spreading the Ideals and philosophy od His Holiness Maharishi Mahesh Yogi
- (kk) To manage, administer, carry on, conduct as hitherto the said school and all other educational institutions for the benefit of Hindi as the mother tongue minorities and thers as well, irrespective of caste, community, religion or social status.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS
OF
MAHARISHI INSTITUTE OF CREATIVE
INTELLIGENCE**

01. Name of the Society :

**MAHARISHI INSTITUTE OF CREATIVE
INTELLIGENCE.**

02. Short Title :

These rules and regulations may be called rules of the
Maharishi Institute of Creative Intelligence.

03. Definitions:

**In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the
subject of context.**

(I) "Society" means Maharishi Institute of Creative
Intelligence in India.

- (ii) "Members" means the members of the Maharishi Institute of Creative Intelligence in India.
- (iii) "Managing Committee" means the Managing Committee of Maharishi Institute of Creative Intelligence duly formed from amongst the members of the Institute.
- (iv) Service of notice or any communication shall be presumed to have been effected on the members, if the same is sent under certificate of posting on the last known address as recorded with the Institute. Change of address must be got acknowledged from the Institute.

04. Membership:

Membership of the Society shall be open, subject to the approval of the Managing Committee, to persons irrespective of caste, creed or community, who have faith in Maharishi's teachings and who practice Transcendental Meditation.

05. Procedure of Enrolment:

Individuals desirous of being enrolled as members shall apply to the Society giving the particulars on a Form prescribed by the Managing Committee. The Managing Committee of the Society shall deal with Membership.

The Managing Committee reserves the right to accept or deny membership to any Individual without giving any reason and its decision shall be final.

06. Patrons:

Any distinguished person can be appointed as a Patron of the Institute by the Managing Committee. Persons having special knowledge in the fields of science, art, literature, religion or any special branch can be appointed as patrons of the Institute.

The President/Vice-President/General Secretary of the Institute shall have the powers to send letters of request to important persons for their approval for being appointed as the Patrons of the Institute. Any member of the Institute can also be designated as a Patron of the Institute.

The following shall be the first patrons of the Institute:-

1. Hon'ble Mr. Justice S. Rangarajan, 1 Zakir Hussain Road, New Delhi.
2. Hon'ble Mr. Justice V.S. Deshpande, 2, Duplex Lane, New Delhi.
3. Hon'ble Mr. Justice S.N. Shankar, 77, Shahjahan Road, New Delhi.



07. Ordinary Members:

Any person of sound mind may be made an ordinary member of the Society, who has unflinching faith in the teachings of Maharishi Mahesh Yogi and who wants to enjoy full potential of life through the knowledge of the Science of Creative Intelligence and is practicing Transcendental Meditation and who agrees to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Society. The Membership fee shall be voluntary.

08. Special Members:

Any person having specialization in any field in which the society is actively engaged or persons useful for the Society can be enrolled by the Managing Committee as special member. However, It shall be necessary for any individual desirous of becoming a special member to have unflinching faith in the aims & objects of the Society and should be practitioner of Transcendental Meditation & Transcendental Meditation Siddhi Programme.

09. Termination of Membership

- a) Any member of society, who works against the interest and objectives of the society will cease to remain its member. The managing committee shall have the power to take decision regarding termination of membership .
- b) A member of the Society would cease to be a member of the Society/Managing Committee if:-

- (i) He/She dies, resigns, becomes of unsound mind, become insolvent or is convicted of a criminal offence.
 - (ii) He/She does not attend three consecutive meetings of Committee/ Society without leave in writing from the President or Secretary.
- c) A member may resign his membership by a letter addressed to the President of the Society. The Managing Committee shall accept such resignations. The intimation of termination shall be given to the members concerned in writing.

10. Renewal of Membership:

A member who has tendered his resignation or who ceases to be a member, is willing to become a member and is eligible to be enrolled as a member, may be re-enrolled as a member at his/her request.

11. Powers, Duties & Functions of General Body :

The General Body shall nominate 12 persons from amongst the members of General Body to form Managing Committee.

12. General Meeting:

A meeting of the members shall be held once in a year (which will be called Annual General Meeting) and the following business will be transacted:-

- (i) Adoption of the Annual Accounts and consideration of the Annual Report;
- (ii) Appointment of auditors for the next year.
- (iii) Formation of the Managing Committee for the next year;
- (iv) Consideration of any other matter with the permission of Chairman of the meeting.

13. Extraordinary General Meeting:

In case of extra ordinary need, an Extraordinary General Meeting of the members shall be called. Decision to call the Extraordinary General Meeting shall be taken in the meeting of Managing Committee.

14. Quorum and Notice of the General Meeting:

Quorum for conducting the Annual General Meeting shall be $2/3^{\text{rd}}$ of the members enrolled at the time of Annual General Meeting.

Notice for conducting the Annual General Meeting shall be given by the General Secretary in consultation with the President.

15. Managing Committee:

a) The strength of the Managing Committee shall be 12.

b) The Managing Committee shall comprise of:

(I) President

(II) Vice-President (2)

(III) General Secretary

(IV) Treasurer

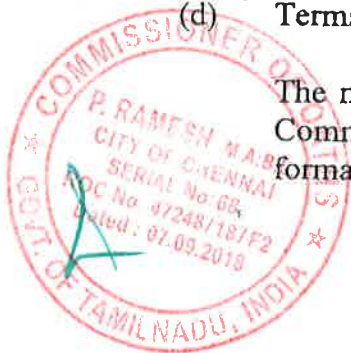
(V) Four members excluding the above office bearers to be nominated from amongst the members of the Society.

(c) Formation of Managing Committee:

The Managing Committee shall be formed from amongst the members of the Society at its Annual General Meeting. Every enrolled member present in the meeting shall cast one vote.

(d) Terms of office bearers of the Managing Committee:

The members including the office bearers of the Managing Committee shall hold office for one year or until the formation of next Managing Committee whichever is later.

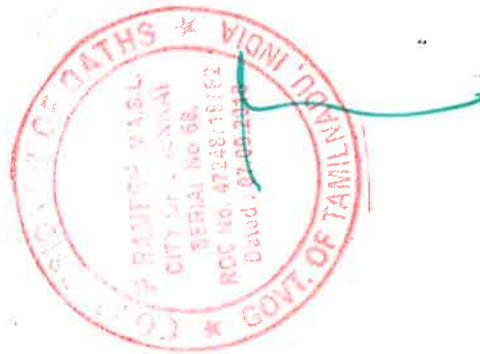
16. Function of the Managing Committee:

President: The President of the Institute shall be the main office bearer and he shall be person to formulate all the schemes and plans for spreading the knowledge of Maharishi Mahesh Yogi by establishing centres for achieving the aims and objects.

The President shall preside over the meetings of the Managing Committee of the Institute. In case of absence of President either the Vice-President and in absence of Vice-President any person senior in the age may chair the meeting of Managing Committee.

Vice-Presidents: The Vice-Presidents shall function alongwith the President. He or she shall perform such functions as may be assigned to him or her by the President. Before taking any action independently, the Vice-President shall have to take a formal consent in writing from the President and shall be guided by such instructions as may be received by him or her, from time to time from the President.

In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall preside over the meetings of the Managing Committee and shall exercise all powers and perform all the functions of the President. He or she shall also assist the President in day to day functions of the Institute.

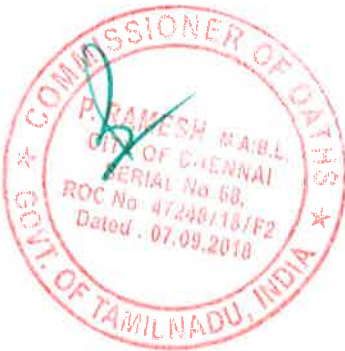

General Secretary: The General Secretary of the Institute shall be the main Executive Office-bearer besides the President.

He shall look after the administrative functions, which are needed for the establishment of the Institute in India. He shall have the powers regarding the appointment of the staff of the Institute and their dismissal, taking premises on rent for the Institute on behalf of the Institute and shall perform all such functions of administrative nature which relate to the working of the Institute. He shall write letters to important personalities and to persons having command in the fields of Science, Art, Literature and Religion and request them to become Patrons of the Institute. The General Secretary shall consult the President or the Vice-Presidents of the Institute, as the case may be, but for his administrative actions, he shall act independently subject to the scrutiny and approval of his actions by the Managing Committee. He shall :-

- (i) maintain an up-to-date register of the members indicating their ages, addresses and occupations;
- (ii) summon and attend meeting of the Managing Committee/General Body under instructions from the President and the Vice-Presidents as the circumstances may require;
- (iii) circulate agenda for the meeting;
- (iv) record the proceedings of the meeting of the Managing Committee/General Body;

- (v) conduct the day to day correspondence of the Institute and sign on behalf of the Institute, subject to the approval of the President and the Vice-Presidents in all important matters.
- (vi) Prepare yearly reports on the working of the Institute;
- (vii) Carry on such other duties as may be assigned to him by the President or the Vice-Presidents, as the case may be; and

Treasure: He or she shall maintain regular account of all money received and spent by the Institute for the furtherance of the activities.

17. Termination/Removal of Office Bearers:

- 01. A member of the Managing Committee would cease to be a member of the Managing Committee if :-
 - (i) He/She dies, resigns, becomes unsound mind, become insolvent or is convicted of a criminal offence.
 - (ii) He/She does not attend three consecutive meetings of Committee/ Society without leave in writing from the President or Secretary.

02. Any member of the Managing Committee, who works against the interest and objectives of the Society will cease to remain its member. The Managing Committee shall have the power to take decisions regarding Termination of Membership.
03. A member of the Managing Committee, failing to attend 4 consecutive meetings, without sufficient reasons being shown to the satisfaction of the Institute, shall cease to be a member of the Managing Committee.
04. A member may resign his membership by a letter addressed to the President of the Society. The Managing Committee shall accept such resignations.

18. Filling Up of Vacancies:

If a member or office-bearer of the Managing Committee resigns or dies or is terminated/removed from the membership of the Institute before the expiry of his term of office, the Managing Committee may opt any person from amongst the remaining members of the Society.

19. Quorum and Notice of Meeting of the Managing Committee:

The quorum necessary for the meeting of Managing Committee should be $2/3^{\text{rd}}$ of the members of the Managing Committee then in office.

Notice for conducting the Meeting of Managing Committee shall be given by the President or the General Secretary.

Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority vote. In case of a tie, the President shall have the second vote.

A Minute Book shall be provided and kept by the General Secretary, and all proceedings of the meeting shall be entered in this book.

Each enrolled member shall have one vote. The vote shall be cast by members present. Members who have any payment or dues against the Society, shall have no voting right.

The Managing Committee shall prepare the budget and statement of Accounts every year, which shall be passed at the Annual General Meeting of the Society.

The meeting of the Managing Committee shall be held as & when required.

In case of a situation that a member is away from the actual venue of the meeting and he can not attend the meeting physically due to circumstances beyond his control, and he is available on phone, he can participate in the meeting through conference phone and he can give his opinion/decision on phone. Later on he can confirm his opinion/decision by writing a letter addressed to the Managing Committee.

In case of any discrepancy in his opinion/decision conveyed on phone and in the letter received by Managing Committee the decision of the majority of members present in that meeting shall be final.

In case of emergency a resolution passed by circulation and signed by a majority of members of Managing Committee shall be effective as a resolution passed at a meeting duly held.

No member of the Society shall be entitled to any remuneration from the Society. The members shall be paid such allowances as may be decided by the Managing Committee from time to time. The expenses made towards boarding, lodging and tours/meeting undertaken in connection with the activities of the Society shall be paid with the approval of the President and in absence of President by the General Secretary.

Any member of the Managing Committee can resign from his office by a letter addressed to President/Vice-Presidents and his resignation shall be effective from the date it is accepted by the Managing Committee.

20. Decisions:

All matters shall be decided by majority votes of the members present at a meeting. In the event of a tie, the President shall have a right to exercise a casting vote.



21. Service of Notice:

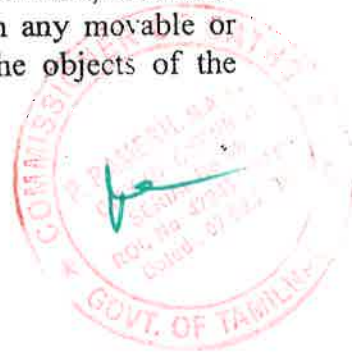
Any notice sent to a member of the Institute shall be deemed to have been served if it satisfies clause 3 (iv) of these rules and regulations.

22. Powers of the Managing Committee:

The Managing Committee shall have the right to exercise all such powers as are necessary for the proper control and management of the affairs of the Institute.

It shall also have the following powers:-

- (i) To open, operate or close an account with any scheduled bank or banks and to authorise any two persons to operate the account.
- (ii) To empower the General Secretary or any other member to perform all or any of the powers of the Committee;
- (iii) To appoint one or more sub-committees to carry on the work of the Institute subject to the control and approval of the Managing Committee;
- (iv) To purchase, take or give on lease or hire, otherwise acquire, sell, manage, or deal with any movable or immovable property for any of the objects of the Institute.

- (v) To borrow or raise money by holding cultural or charity shows, or in any other lawful manner that the Institute may think fit;
- (vi) To invest any money of the Institute not immediately required for any of its objects, as may be determined by the Managing Committee;
- (vii) To undertake or execute any trust that may be inducive to any of the objects of the Institute.

23. Operation of Bank Accounts:

The funds of the Society shall be kept in any nationalised bank/s in any town or city. The Bank Accounts of the Society shall always be operated jointly by any two persons authorised by a specific resolution passed by Managing Committee.

The Managing Committee for administrative convenience may change the signatory/ies of any account/s in any bank from time to time as and when the need arises by passing a resolution to this effect.

24. Legal Proceeding and Jurisdiction:

All the suits and legal proceedings on or for the Society shall be in the name of the General Secretary.

The legal jurisdiction for all suits for and against the Society shall be under the jurisdiction of Delhi Court.

25. Financial Year:

The financial year of the Institute shall be reckoned from 1st of April each year to 31st March in the following year.

26. Audit:

The accounts of the Institute for every year shall be audited by a Chartered Accountant and his report shall be appended to the Annual Report to be submitted by the Managing Committee at the Annual General Meeting.

27. The Institute shall file with the Registrar of Societies a list of members of the Managing Committee every year after its formation at the Annual General Meeting required under section 4 of the Act.

In case any amendments are made in the Memorandum or Rules and Regulation of the Institute, the same shall be in accordance with the provision of section 12 of the Societies Registration Act.

29. All the provisions of the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 (Punjab Amendment) Act, 1957, as extended to the Union Territory of Delhi, shall apply to the Institute.

30. Indemnity:

Subjects to the provisions of the Societies Registration Act, XXI of 1860 (Punjab Amendment Act, 1957) as extended to the Union Territory of Delhi, the President, Vice Presidents,



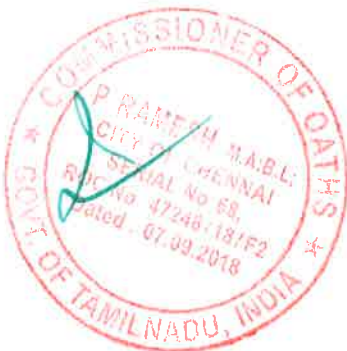

the General Secretary and Treasurer and their heirs, executors and administrators respectively shall be indemnified out of the assets of Institute from and against all suits proceedings, costs, charges, losses, damages and expenses which they or any of them shall or may incur or sustain by reasons of any act done committed in or about the execution of the duty in their respective offices except such loss (if any) as they shall or may incur or sustain by or through their own willful neglect or default respectively and no such officer shall be answerable for the acts, receipts neglects or defaults of any other officer or for solvency or honesty of any member or other persons with whom any moneys or effects belonging to the Institute may be lodged or deposited for safe custody or for insufficiency or any security upon which any money of the Institute shall be invested or any other loss or damage due to any such cause as aforesaid or which may result from the execution of his office unless the same shall happen through the willful neglect or default of such officer.

31. Amendment:

Passed in the Annual General Meeting held on May, 30th 1980.

- (1) The General Secretary is empowered to appoint a Council of Secretaries consisting of 7 to 11 Initiators / Teachers to organise the day-to-day activities of the Society.

- (2) The Members of the Council of Secretaries shall be directly responsible to the General Secretary who will be the head of the Council.
- (3) The Council of Secretaries is empowered to take decision regarding purchase, sale, mortgage, hire/rent and manage movable and immovable properties on behalf of the Institute.
- (4) The Council of Secretaries is empowered to open, close or amend the operation of any bank account/s in the name of the Institution.
- (5) The Council of Secretaries will take any such decision stated above in the meeting under the Chairmanship of the General Secretary and shall maintain proper Minute Book;
- (6) The Managing Committee should be informed about the activities and about any big transactions immediately either in the meeting or through letters;
- (7) The Council of Secretaries is empowered to appoint, terminate or suspend the services of any Initiator or staff member and they can also take any other disciplinary action against any Initiator or staff;
- (8) To take loan from the bank or any financial Institution by pledging or mortgaging movable and immovable property/ies of the Institute;

- (9) To invest money in the bank shares or certificates or deposit in the business houses. To earn highest possible rate of interest and satisfactory security of money.
- (10) To establish links with voluntary Industry Commission, State and National Khadi Boards, the Handicraft Boards and other National and International development Organisations;
- (11) To promote the health of the people by starting the Transcendental Meditation, T.M. Siddhi Programmes and establishing Ayurvedic and nature cure Hospitals;

- (14) To accept, receive, give and take voluntary donations, grants etc. from Individuals, Organisations and private and Government bodies in India and abroad for the furtherance of the object of the Society;
